The event was the first Nimham Mountain Music Festival, produced by H.G. Fairfield Arts to benefit two Mid-Hudson Valley veteran projects: the 13th

annual Chief Daniel Nimham Intertribal Veterans Memorial PowWow this August, and the U.S. Military Veterans Motorcycle Club NY4's documentary aimed at curbing veteran suicides.

Performers included the Nimham Mountain Singers of Kent; Bethany Yarrow, Rufus Cappadocia and Braham Fribgane; Martha Redbone; and the band Iron Cobra.
